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Presidential Message

Dear Colleagues and Clinic Owners:

As we begin a new year, I would like to welcome two new members to our Board. They are Dr. Kimberly Ogletree, African-American member and Dr. Brad Russell, District 6 member. I believe both will prove to be assets to the Board as they begin their work with state regulation.

As I write my final presidential message, I am reminded of a very fitting quote that applies to the overall theme of my message. Spoken by Martin Luther King Jr so precisely, it states, "Cowardice asks the question, 'Is it safe?' Expediency asks the question 'Is it politic?' Vanity asks the question, 'Is it popular?' But conscience asks the question, 'Is it right?' And there comes a time when one must take a position that is neither

safe, nor politic, nor popular, but one must take it because one's conscience tells one that it is right". Today, I take my position because it is "the right thing to do". If you ever read a president's message, this is the one. As I am approaching the end of my term as president of the ASBCE, I want to reflect upon this past year and give a very unadulterated analysis of the year. I wish that I could say all was perfect from beginning to end of my term, but truth does not exist in

that statement. I write this letter to state fact in the name of transparency, something that doesn't seem to exist very often in the world. At the end of the day, I believe it is past time that each of you are able to look though a clear window into the Board and its operation so that you may see "The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly". Only when the truth is brought to light can we move this great profession forward.

THE GOOD

- Your Board is in good hands with Mrs. Sheila Bolton as its' Executive Director. She has served with exemplary diligence and integrity for over 23 years. Sheila is the Board's "hands and feet" in carrying out its mission and vision. She has the reputation in Montgomery as one of the best in her position in Alabama.
- Support staff Amy Deavers and Ashley Stewart help Sheila in making sure you, the licensee, have all your necessary items in place in order to practice without interruptions in your practice operation. This year was seamlessly smooth and much of this is their dedication to helping each and every licensee with renewals, continuing education questions, applications and reinstatements.
- Jim Ward, Esq., our legal counsel, was awarded another contract to continue serving our legal needs. All major cases this year were brought to resolution. Mr. Ward has served our Board professionally and honorably since 1995.
- Dr. Garver continues to guide our wellness program, which has become a model wellness program for many states throughout our country and for many other agencies in Alabama. The success rate of this program is amazing!
- Under my leadership, a chiropractic legislative roundtable was convened. This is the first roundtable convened in over 25 years. Members of the Board, ASCA, CSA, and interested chiropractors met on two occasions to examine possible changes needed to our code and / or rules to lead us forward in a proactive manner. Two meetings have convened thus far with more planned to occur in 2019.
- Implementation of records conversion at the Board office to the cloud as a result of analysis performed by me and approved by the Board is starting to see major cost savings. As a result of implementing this conversion, the Board was able to attrition the position left vacant by the retirement of Deborah Darnell. But the bigger news is that, as a result of implementing this process, it appears that no increase in license renewal fees will be necessary for at least 4-5 more years.
- The "Dry Needling" rule was passed and published in November 2018. As president, I made sure this rule was guided through the process in a timely and efficient manner. Although MASA (Medical Association the State of Alabama) opposed this rule in the beginning, they dropped their opposition, after we presented evidence that this was within our scope of practice. This entire process was a great collaborative effort by the Board and the ASCA leadership.
- The Preceptor/Extern Rule was changed to streamline the process and encourage greater participation. The Board listened to concerns of those who utilized this program and acted to make necessary changes in the rule guiding this process
- Under my leadership, the Board ended the year \$166,000.00 under budget. Cash flow for 2018 was \$91,000.00 greater than actual expenses!
- Board finances are better today than they were when I was elected president. The financial position of the Board is very strong once again. There has not been an increase in annual license renewal fees since 2009!

THE BAD

- "A half-truth is even more dangerous than a lie. A lie, you can detect at some stage, but a half truth is sure to mislead you for long." Anurag Shourie, Half a Shadow. Our Board has been attacked over the past year, primarily by a disgruntled outgoing Board member who has been disruptive to the Board's function for some time. By promulgating half-truths during this year through electronic and written communication, this member has struck fear in many, particularly those who are early in their practice careers. Below is a list of the bad that the Board had to contend with, some of which we are still contending with.
 - In January I was elected by my peers to serve as president. I was welcomed by a disgruntled Board member and his adversarial attorney, claiming to represent the member and 12 other chiropractors who they would not name.
- This attorney presented the Board with a list of open meetings requests. I directed to release all but the last item

of the request, which was a request to allow the disgruntled Board member to view all the ballots cast in the 2017 District 3 election. A vote is private and each licensee has a sacred right for their vote to remain private. As licensees, we are required to sign our ballots and confirm our residency. We should be able to cast our votes with full assurance of total confidentiality.

Yes, the request was denied, and although the Board was subject to open ridicule by this particular Board member, I stood firm as your Board president to protect your right to privacy in voting. All other Board

members gave me their full support in my stance.

As a result of the above request, and my resulting denial, a request was placed for the Chief Examiner of Public Accounts, Rachel Riddle, to attend the next Board meeting. After the meeting, Ms. Riddle explained that she, as chief examiner, had the authority to audit the election results. After assuring me and Mrs. Bolton that she would be the only one to see the ballots and that she had the authority to audit, an audit was performed the next week. The audited results were exactly the same results that the independent agency obtained.

Not relenting, the disgruntled Board member submitted a motion that would allow him to see all ballots cast. The motion failed, but the fact that this Board member thought he had a right to see private ballots

should alarm every licensee!

The same Board member made another motion in the summer to "lower license renewal fees to \$150.00 from \$300.00". This would be great if 1) it was legal, and 2) if Board operations weren't running at near the current \$300.00 license fee. It was explained to the licensee how this was not legal or prudent and he even told the Board he understood. Yet, the motion was still made. The motion died for a lack of a second. Even the members who usually vote in concert with this member, wouldn't second his motion. Why? Because the Board couldn't operate and the State would have to take over our operations.

THE UGLY

This same disgruntled Board member led an effort based on false information to hold up an attorney's contract at the State House and in the Governor's office. This, all because he didn't want to abide by the wishes of the majority of the Board in re-hiring Jim Ward Esq., as legal counsel. As a result, I and other members of the Board had to spend time in Montgomery cleaning up the mess that a disgruntled Board member made.

But, even with the bad and the ugly, overall it was a great year for the Board which translates to a great year for licensees. You now have more opportunity to practice to the fullest extent of your education, Preceptor/Extern opportunities are greater and friendlier than ever before, and license renewal fees have held steady now since 2009. Looking forward license renewal fees should continue steady with no increase anticipated as necessary for at least 3-5 years.

As we enter the new year, let's all remember that our calling is great, and we are fortunate to practice the greatest profession in the world. So, go out and heal the suffering and help those with good health keep the same. And, may God bless you with good health and prosperity in 2019.
